# 5. Annual Spring Conference, London (two venues) 1<sup>st</sup> to 2<sup>nd</sup> April, 2017

The lecture sessions were followed by conducted tours of the RPS Museum led by John Betts and Peter Homan.

#### 6. Pharmaceutical Historian

Four issues of the *Pharmaceutical Historian* (Vol. 46, Nos. 1,2,3,4) were published during the year in March, June, September and December. Issue 1 was the last one to be edited by Ainley Wade. Stuart Anderson took over the editorship given a new arrangement to publish the journal on-line (with Ingenta) and thus internationally with the International Society for the History of Pharmacy. In achieving this collaboration the journal received the subtitle *An International Journal for the History of Pharmacy*. Printed copies continued to be produced.

#### 7. BSHP Gazette

To coincide with the above, a new newsletter was introduced and entitled %BSHP Gazette+. This would contain items no longer possible in the *Pharmaceutical Historian*. Key aims of this were to share committee news, forward dates, reports on BSHP events, and general pharmacy history news. The first issue was dated June 2017 and the intention was to publish in the same months as the Historian resulting in three issues in 2017.

#### 8. BSHP Website

Our new website was launched in October 2017 with a lot more functionality, new features and a more modern appearance. Thanks must go to Briony Hudson for heading up this project and also to Robert Harrison at our Secretariat office for developing this new site which has been well received.
