Burnby Memorial Bursary 2018

Applications for our annual prize for students will be launched in July. The Burnby Memorial Bursary, worth £500, is open to all students. The Bursary pays for their attendance at the conference plus £250. Previous winners have included both pharmacy and history students, on topics ranging from treatments for eczema, pharmacists in the NHS, and medicines in 1914.
