Leslie Matthews Medal

We were very pleased to have accepted a nomination for Professor Terry Turner to be awarded the Leslie Matthews medal for his contributions to original and scholarly work in the history of British pharmacy



In receiving his medal from Briony Hudson at a special ceremony in July Terry Turner said:

"I am very honoured to receive this award, particularly because, as a founder member of the British Society for the History of Pharmacy, I knew Leslie Matthews. In accepting the medal, I reflect on the extent of pharmacy history collections in Wales - at the National Museum, the Cardiff Story, the National Botanic Garden of Wales, and in the University's own Special Collections and Archive - and feel encouraged that pharmacy history has a bright future and I have played a part in this."

Burnby Memorial Bursary 2018

Applications for our annual prize for students are now invited. The Burnby Memorial Bursary, worth £500, is open to all students. The successful applicant will have an opportunity to present a short talk on an area of original pharmacy history research at our 2018 conference (to be held near Nottingham). The Bursary pays for their attendance at the conference plus £250. Previous winners have included both pharmacy and history students, on topics ranging from treatments for eczema, pharmacists in the NHS, and medicines in 1914.
