Annual Conference: 6-8 April

Plans are well advanced for our 2018 Conference being held at the Best Western Premier Yew Lodge Hotel, Kegworth, Derbyshire (near Nottingham). All who have booked to attend should have received detailed information in an email in mid-February from Briony Hudson our conference organiser.

Booking is closed now and a very full programme is all set. On the Sunday morning, after our AGM, we will be welcoming Alex Bowmer the winner of this year's Burnby Bursary. His talk is entitled "A View from the Farm: Antimicrobial Resistance Before Antibiotics, c. 1940-1960."

On the Saturday afternoon we are looking forward to a visit to the Boots Archive in Nottingham. There will be a report on this and on the whole conference in the June Gazette.

Annual General Meeting

Our AGM will take place at 9.30am on Sunday 8 April as part of our conference weekend. Members will be asked to approve last year's Annual Report and our Financial Report for 2017. Elections of Officers will take place and endorsement will be sought for the other members of the current committee. Burnby Memorial Bursary 2018

As reported above the winner of this year's Burnby Memorial Bursary was Alex Bowmer, a PhD student from Kings College, London. We were encouraged by having received 8 applications this year, the increase being due largely to publicity on Facebook and Twitter. A number of unsuccessful applicants are presenting posters at the conference.

The Bursary application forms for 2019 will be available in July.

Evening meeting held on Monday 5 February

Here is a summary of this recent event for your information and interest.

Dr Petros Bouras-Vallianatos, shown right, presented his lecture on "Byzantine Pharmacology between East and West" to a large audience at the UCL School of Pharmacy. He is a Wellcome Trust Research Fellow at King's College London, and has made an extensive study of early Greek medicinal manuscripts.

From this research he explained how knowledge was transferred throughout the Mediterranean area in the Byzantine era. In those days sugar syrup was an important medicinal product and especially *Julep* which was this syrup mixed with water. Honey was first used before the widespread introduction of refined sugar.

Examples of recipes from early Greek pharmacopoeia manuscripts were given.



Summer Visit to Blythe House - Friday 8 June

This visit is timed for 11.30am on the above date and the cost will be £10 per head. Blythe House is near Olympia in West London and holds a number of museums' collections including 170,000 objects from the Science Museum which is our main focus of interest as described below.

From stethoscopes to Egyptian Mummies, the Science Museum cares for one of the largest and richest medical collections in the world. At their heart is the Wellcome Collection. Henry Wellcome, of the Burroughs Wellcome and co. drugs company, amassed a fortune from introducing tableted medicines into Britain which he then ploughed into his passions - anthropology, history and the history of medicine. On this tour, there will be an opportunity to see pharmacy glassware and equipment from the early 19th century onwards, an entire room of mortars and pestles as well as stunning ceramicware collected from pharmacies across the globe.

Once registered you can select which articles you wish to download. The total number of downloads for 2017 was 327 plus another 34 by the end of January, making a total of 361. The most popular papers so far have been Sylvia Michelletti's on Exotic Poisons and Owen Durant's on the Doctrine of Signatures. We will monitor the numbers on a monthly basis.

We have been working on a collaborative project to digitise all the back issues of the *Pharmaceutical Historian* from 2016 back to 1967. We will make a further announcement about this in due course but we are quite excited about this extension to our own historical archive.
