Monday 20th May 2024 6.30 pm Brebajes, Yerbas, and Pharmacopeias: Healing Materiality and the Imagination of the Early Modern Caribbean Professor Pablo Gomez, University of Wisconsin-Madison



Professor Gomez's work focuses on the history of knowledge, science, and the history of health and corporeality in Latin America, the Caribbean, the African diaspora and, more generally, the Iberian and Black Atlantic Worlds. His books include multiple-award winning The Experiential Caribbean: Creating Knowledge and Healing in the Early Modern Atlantic. His latest publication is an edited volume, The Gray Zones of Medicine, which examines the role of unlicensed health practitioners in the shaping of Latin American history.

The Leslie Matthews Medal

Call closes on 30 April 2024

The medal is the Society's highest honour, created in memory of Mr Leslie G Matthews (1897-1997), a barrister, pharmacist and scholar. It is awarded for original and scholarly work in the history of British pharmacy. Evaluation is based on competence of research, skill in interpretation and ability in presentation. We interpret pharmacy broadly, to cover all the aspects of materia medica and pharmacy policy and practice that fall in the scope of the Society. Recipients do not need to be members of the Society. Self-nominations are not accepted. Previous winners are listed at the Society's website, including Briony Hudson (pictured) who won the 2018 medal.
